



Canadian Navigable Waters Act

Ontario Power Generation hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, **Ontario Power Generation** has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) under the NPP File Number 2021-404730 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

- Geotechnical drilling investigation program at a discrete portion of Lake Ontario near the OPG Darlington facility over an approximately 7-month period. The program requires the completion of soil and bedrock drilling, cone penetration testing (CPT) and in-situ geotechnical and geophysical testing at approximately 16 borehole locations and 6 CPT locations at the lakebed. Drilling activities will be carried out using drill rigs working from two floating barges, coupled with the implementation of appropriate erosion and sediment control measures (i.e., use of drill casings to limit the mobilization of disturbed sediment).
